CHILD ABDUCTION: If your child has been <u>abducted by a family member</u>, (<u>www.ontario.ca/page/child-abduction-family-member</u>) you can apply to the family court to have the child returned to you, even if they have been taken out of Ontario. Call 9-1-1 or contact the local police if you believe your child has been abducted.

NON-REMOVAL: You can apply to the family court for an order to prevent one or both parents from taking their child out of a specified area.

IMPORTANT: You must provide an accurate description of the parties and children (if any) affected by the attached order. This is necessary so that a complete and readily accessible record can be entered onto the Canadian Police Information Centre (CPIC) system.

If the person filling out this form requires more space to identify other individuals who are protected by this order (if there is more than one person in Part A or more than three children in Part C), please complete a separate page and attach it to this form.

INFORMATION FOR COURT STAFF

IMPORTANT: Court staff **MUST** attach a copy of the issued court order to this form and provide all documents to the appropriate enforcement agency (e.g., local court officers, municipal, provincial, federal police or peace officers, including Canada Borders Service Agency, as required).

DO NOT attach a copy of the CPIC form to any documents that need to be served on the person(s) named in Part B of this form. If court staff are arranging for service through the sheriff/enforcement office, please complete form FLR_A_6EO: Information for Service of Restraining Order.

Completed CPIC Forms are <u>not</u> to be placed or kept in the court file. Please refer to your Family Procedures Manual for more information about how to process and manage these types of orders.
